Introduction

Today is Trinity Sunday. It is also the Sunday when we remember, Jesus commissioning his disciples from Matthew's Gospel and he sends them out to baptise in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Trinity identifies and names the relationship between God who exists in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit; creator, redeemer and comforter.

Although the word Trinity does not appear in the Bible, there are various passages that support the idea, especially in the New Testament.

Reflection from Micheal Gillott

With this week leading us to Trinity Sunday I am honoured and humbled to be asked to share this reflection. I will be concentrating on the Matthew and Corinthians readings.

In the Corinthians reading Paul writes that we are to grow in <u>maturity</u> in the Lord and <u>encourage</u> each other and live in harmony and peace. I feel that Paul's final greetings to the church in Corinth are even more important today than ever, as we find our way forward. The church in Corinth had the advantage of being developed on lines already laid out elsewhere in the New Testament church. However, during this time of change that we are experiencing, there is no previous model that we can build on in our new circumstances, just as the first disciples faced a totally blank canvas when Jesus gave them the great commission (which is our Matthew reading).

Therefore, I feel these readings have come at just the right time to help us in our new emerging way of worshipping our Lord and Saviour. Responding to the great commission as it comes to us afresh today, we can discern the true sense in which Jesus originally gave it, not just as a guide-line but also instructions on how to grow in His new way.

We, like the disciples then, find ourselves facing a brand-new way of thinking going forward in this time. We are being prepared for this new way of ministry and mission. During this time of preparation, it seems that the Scriptures truly say everything that needs to be said. Jesus gives us the recipe for success; we only need to follow the recipe and we can't falter.

Paul knew that although we have the recipe those following it need to have spiritual maturity and always wait upon the Lord before setting into motion the next step.

Creating disciples seems to be the greatest ingredient in our recipe but it is important that these disciples be mature enough in the Spirit to be sent out to make disciples in their turn. In these difficult times, returning to Paul's greeting, we see a lot of encouragement of the right qualities of character and that prayer is needed. Only with these can we achieve harmony and peace in our lives together.

The beginning of the book of Acts shows, wonderfully, the way the early disciples made this work step by step. In these days, I don't think the steps we take to make this new way work for everyone need to be too drastic.

These words have been with me since this time of trial started and it seems right on this Trinity Sunday, in thinking of the unity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit to come together in and finding our way forward - going back to the basic instructions that Jesus gave his Disciples. May we prayerfully consider these things and I pray that the Lord will raise up His servants who will build the new way out of the ashes and bring us all closer in His loving embrace.

We pray for peace of mind, in places where ventures seem to have failed and confidence has been lost. We pray for the reassurance of your presence, Lord Jesus where it is needed and your Holy Spirit will

We pray for children as they have the opportunity to go back to school, for the teachers and the staff who support them. We remember all those who can now resume 'life outside of lockdown'. We think of our own families and we pray that you will keep them safe and be there in their going out and their coming in. All these prayers we ask in the name of Jesus.
