Readings

Isaiah 12 - Praise to God for grace and salvation!

John 15 vv 16-27

Jesus appoints us to go and bear fruit - but the world will hate us and persecute us for it, just as He was persecuted...

Reflection (on John 17 v14) by Rev. Peter Heckels - "They do not belong to the world..."

I believe that Jesus calls us to be in the world, but not of the world. We are called to be different, to change and be more like Jesus, obedient to God and his ways rather than following the ways and standards of this world. Is this easy? Of course not.

Firstly, we will find it impossible to be like Jesus and will constantly fall as we try to follow his way, but thankfully Jesus is there to pick us up and set us on our way once more. Where would we be without Grace?

Secondly as Jesus reminds us, the world will hate us as it hated him, for the world so full of evil cannot cope with the love of God when it is there in the midst of all that is going on. Yet says Jesus he "chose you from this world, and you do not belong to it." (John 15 v19). So again, how do we cope, only through Jesus promise that he will send the Holy Spirit our Helper (John 15 v26).

We are called to be 'Salt for all mankind' (Matthew 5 v13); 'Light to the world' and 'a city on a hill' (Matthew 5 v14).

Both these tasks take place in the world where we are God's agents for his purpose, yeast making the bread rise (Matthew 13 v33). These are the tasks of disciples of Jesus, entrusted to you and me, the church of Christ.

There is much talk about a 'new normal', but should the church not be going back to its age old commission to bring the Gospel, the Good news of Jesus to a world in desperate need of love and forgiveness. Of course, we need to explore new ways of sharing this message, or we could always go back to the old ways which if we are honest are not really working.

The truth is we have a new opportunity as so many people are re-evaluating their lives by offering them the real hope found in Jesus. We can offer the reality that everyone no matter what race, colour, sex, age is valued by God, that everyone can receive his grace and have the promise of life in all its fulness both here on earth and into eternity, once they accept what God has done for them in Jesus. Our 'new normal' needs to see all of us taking our responsibilities for sharing this Good News. Not all of us are called to be preachers, teachers, evangelists, or apostles, but we are all called to be disciples, witnesses to Jesus and his impact on our lives.

So, what are we to do? We can all get on our knees and take this fight to the world. We can pray for our leaders, both church and state, instead of constantly criticise as the world seems to. We can pray for family, those in real need during these times, the sick, the bereaved, the isolated, those anxious about job security and the necessary means to support their families.

We can pray for all who feel wounded, weary, and broken that God will have mercy, bring healing and peace. We can pray that as we struggle and juggle a new way of living that the Holy Spirit will stir a hunger in our nation that only Jesus can fill. We can pray that our churches will be given new imagination and creativity to proclaim the Good News of Jesus in word and deed, and that the Holy Spirit will direct our future to be the church Jesus wants. We can pray for our ministers to be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit and offer ourselves as disciples to serve here and now.

Then we can pray that we may have the courage simply to let God do his work.

So, let us go in faith to be a boat on the waters of this world sailing wherever God leads. But remember the boat is on the water, but if the water gets into the boat the boat will surely sink. 'You are in the world not of it'
