Reflection - The Manor Church and Community Project – by Simon Loveitt

In 2013 ecumenical initiative with the Anglican, Methodist and United Reformed Church saw the appointment of a Church Related Community Worker (Minister) in 2014, to lead on the project and to be part of the transformation of the community in the area of south east Sheffield known as the Manor.

Predominantly residential, the Manor is comprised of a large, low-rise council estate, which has been the focus of major regeneration to provide good quality housing, both rented & owner-occupied. Large areas of the estate were demolished, and in some cases rebuilt with private funding, from the late 1990s.

The area is well served by schools, medical centres, dental surgeries, shopping areas, community resources (nursery, training centre, advice centres etc.). Good public transport is provided by frequent bus services to all areas and the Supertram runs along City Road at Manor Top providing links to Crystal Peak Shopping Centre, Sheffield City Centre and Meadowhall shopping centre.

The Churches on the Manor Estate include St Swithun's Anglican Church, St Theresa's Roman Catholic Church, William Temple LEP (Anglican / Methodist). Around the periphery are St Oswald's Roman Catholic and St Aidan's Anglican Church. St Theresa's Roman Catholic Church has a primary school and nursery provision.

There has been a long history of the church and community working together and the relationships are good and positive ones. For example, during the Easter and summer holidays in 2012 and 2013, there was a children's club run on church premises where the Church provided the venue free of charge and MASKK (Manor After Schools Kids Klub) provide the staff.

The vision was to work ecumenically, and in partnership with others who share our aims, to be agents of God's transformation in the lives both of individuals and the community in the Manor area of Sheffield. The vision was based on our strong belief that the Church is called to be an agent of social change and a vehicle for establishing God's Kingdom. (Micah 6:8)

The proposal to create an ecumenical project to provide support and encouragement for local families and children on the Manor Estate in their faith and life journeys and to build their confidence to engage with church, schools and community. This area of work was identified as a key priority by the local churches in consultation with other relevant community agencies.

In 2015 Manor Church and Community Project Charity was formed. In 2016 William Temple Church was leased from the Anglican Church to be renamed Temple Park Centre. In 2018 Veolia Environmental Trust funded new windows, heating and LED lighting. That was the start of the work which was needed to the building.

It was agreed that there was much more work to be done to transform the Temple Park Centre into a modern, multi-use hub for services and a place to meet at the centre of the Manor Community. Following a number of unsuccessful bids, the climate began to change and the following funds were acquired.

Viridor Credits funded the car park, access paths, ramps and steps, entrance and the reception. Veolia Environmental Trust funded new toilet block, accessible toilet, and flat roof replacement. The Biffa Award funded meeting rooms with holding walls for flexi use, stage conversion to meeting room, corridor at a separate hall from other areas and the redecorating of the building.

Now that the refurbishment work is complete there are plans to increase the services available to the local community and offer it for hire for dance classes and private functions as well as expand family play times.

This work has been an example of God holding this community in love and as clay the community has been moulded to share in the love of Christ. This project is the light of all those who have worked to build bridges, bring faith and hope. The building will provide a sanctuary and will be a light to show and share God's love in and with the community.

Reverend Debora Marschner stated that: "Building community is something we as churches are good at, and providing a safe space for conversation, training and parenting, as well as enabling people to make friends and break cycles of social isolation are all part of our vision.

"We also believe that we may have a role to play in bringing together those who have lived on the Manor for generations and those who have only recently moved in the area. As a continuous presence on the Manor estate, and through the trust we have built over many years, Manor Church and Community Project could be instrumental in building bridges and creating opportunities and encounters that model good community cohesion.

"We'd like to say a massive thank you to everyone who has supported the project with funding, their time and also their prayers. Without you none of this would have been possible. We have created a Centre which will be a huge benefit to the local community for a long time to come."
