Reflection – by Peter Heckels - based on John13: 34 - As I have loved you, you must love one another.

What is love like?

Love is sincere (Romans 12: 9) - Love has an open heart and an open hand. Love knows nothing of corruption or deceit.

Love is generous (2 Corinthians 8: 24; 1 John 4: 11) - Love is marked by sacrificial giving of time, money, energy and gifts to those in any form of need.

Love is active (Hebrews 6: 10; 1 John 3: 18) - Expressions of love are backed with acts of service.

Love is forbearing and forgiving (Ephesians 4: 3; Colossians 3: 12-14) - Love turns a blind eye and deaf ear to the faults and failings of others and quickly releases them from the sins which have hurt us.

Love is uniting (Ephesians 4: 3; Philippians 2: 2; Colossians 2: 2) - Love is always seeking to make peace and heal divisions in families and churches.

Love is positive (1 Corinthians 13: 4-7) - Love believes the best about others, not fearing the worst.

Love is sensitive (Romans 14: 15; Galatians 5: 13) - Love takes care not to say or do anything that will cause another to stumble.

Love is up-building (Ephesians 4: 15; 2 Timothy 2: 22-26) - So that even when a truth is spoken that may hurt, love always aims to build that person into Christ.

Love is the summary of the entire Christian faith (Romans 13: 10; Colossians 3: 14; 1 Corinthians 13: 1 and 14: 1) - Love is the fulfilling of God's Law and must be the Christian's first and foremost aim.

If that portrait of love leaves us breathless, it is meant to, but remember God does not require us to strive for such qualities in our own strength, for this is the gift of His Holy Spirit dwelling within us.
