## Readings

#### Reflection

This week Jesus prayers for his friends, as he knew that they were experiencing difficulties. The reading takes us back before the crucifixion and after the last supper. The prayer actually runs from verse 1 through to verse 26. Jesus realised that his disciples were sorrowful because he had said to them a number of times that he was going to die. They did not understand why and to make matters worse, Jesus had talked about the Advocate who he was sending who would help them to understand the things in the world. Jesus assured them to take courage as he was with them all the time.

For us this morning Jesus sets the example for us. He was about to go to his Father, it was going to be a challenging journey, so before he does anything else he places his situation in God's hands. So he prayers for his disciples, so that they may be one with his Father as he is one with him, he asks for their protection in uncertain times and prays that they may be made ready to go out and be the 'good news' to the world.

As Jesus prays to his Father we see the potential for prayer and how the prayer captures the intimate and urgent tone of Jesus' love and passion for his Father and his disciples. There are echoes here to the prayer which Jesus taught his disciples. Let's just spend a few minutes looking at a couple of the similarities.

- 1. Jesus starts his prayer *Father*, the Disciples prayer starts with the words. "Our Father....
- 2. Jesus asks for *protection from the evil one* and in the Disciple's prayer we ask to be delivered from evil and kept from giving in to temptation.

Now having read or heard the prayer again today, I would like to draw out two aspects from the prayer in John's Gospel. The first one is found from verse 6 to 9 and it is all about giving. The second point is Jesus asking for the disciples to be "sanctified" in the truth in verse 17.

Let us look at the relationship which Jesus has with his Father and with us. In this prayer it is a giving relationship. The verb *give* occurs 17 times in this chapter. The Father gives Jesus authority over all flesh to give eternal life to all whom God has given him during his time on earth. He has given Jesus work to do.

In this *giving* relationship, we could describe it as one where we belong to God and we were given to Jesus so that he could show us how to live in the world. The Father gave his Son as a gift to us and now the Son is asking for us to be given protection by the Father.

We are not being taken out of the world but because we believe that the Father sent the Son we are given protection. The prayer is to offer protection not for our own sake, but also in order that we can fulfil God's mission in the world.

The disciples are to be protected so that they may love as they have been commanded to love in a way that not only draws them into union with the divine love but also shows that love to the world into which they are being sent as Jesus was sent.

You know the saying" What is yours in mine and what is mine is mine" – that doesn't apply here. Jesus concludes the prayer in verse 17 by asking the Father to sanctify the disciples in the truth; through God's word which is truth. This is how we are connected with Jesus. Let us look back at Jesus' statement in John 10:34-36 where his own sanctification is what qualifies him to be God's Son.

Similarly, then, our sanctification on that basis is part of our claim to be children of God. Jesus said that he was sharing his word with us as he gave us the commandment to love one another as he loved us. This sanctification is not about claiming 'godly' status or being 'holier than thou.' It is intended as the way for the disciples (us) to live, to be sent out to share the truth (the word) in the world. It is not a way of being taken out of the world but being sent into it. Remember Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life"

No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." Our sanctification, therefore, comes freely to us through grace knowing that we also need to lose our lives in order to gain it. Take the time to read the Psalm and be encouraged to meditate on God's word day and night. If we truly follow, his way and his truth, the life we give up becomes for us the eternal life in Christ which begins here on earth. Thy kingdom come.

So, this morning, let us examine our prayer lives once more. We are sanctified to be sent into the world as salt and light, being good news to the poor, proclaiming sight to the blind, release to the captives, to be peace makers and care takers of the Earth.

Imagine Jesus, praying this prayer over you
