Readings

Reflection

Last week Simon shared the first part of the reading about the vine drawing our attention to the following: -

Firstly, we are taught to "abide, or remain in the vine" (John 15, v 4, 5 etc). As a vine branch draws its life from the stem so we draw our wisdom, our direction, and our strength from the one with whom we are in relationship.

Jesus is leaving no room for doubt that he is the living source of wisdom and power for us as his disciples.

Secondly, we are warned that those who are serious about discipleship will be "pruned" just as a vine is cut back so that it bears even more fruit (John 15, vv1-2). Those who bear no fruit are fit only for the fire but even those who bear fruit will experience the challenge and pain of pruning.

The Father, who is the vinedresser is gentle, but He is also serious about those purposes. Even a really nice, gentle man like Monty Don on *Gardener's World* recommends pruning when appropriate!

Finally, everything is aimed at making the branches fruitful. How will the branches of the Vine bring glory to God and show the world that we are true disciples of Christ? By bearing much fruit (John 15 v8), a branch joined to the True Vine will bear the "fruits" of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. (Galatians 5, 22-23).

Jesus goes on to remind those who abide in the vine that they do so not at their own choice. In Jesus time a disciple would choose his own rabbi or master and willingly and voluntarily join his school. But with Jesus, the initiative lay entirely with him, Simon and Andrew, James and John, Matthew, Philip, and the others – all were personally called to follow Him, leaving all else behind.

They were chosen by Jesus, these were the ones God had given Him. When we see ourselves as disciples who have been handpicked by Jesus this should transform all we are and how we respond to this call. Malcolm Muggeridge said 'I've never wanted a God or feared a God or felt under any necessity to invent one. Fortunately, I've been driven to the conclusion that God wants me.'

How does it feel to be chosen by God? Once we get over the shock that this is so we can feel unworthy or daunted by the prospect. Yet Jesus has promised that 'you will ask for anything you wish, and you shall have it.' (John 15 v7). This of course is dependent on remaining in the True Vine. Jesus offers us the power of the Holy Spirit all you need do is ask and you will receive. In this way we can stay connected to the True Vine, in this way you are able 'to love one another as Jesus loves us.' (John 15v12).

In this way we are called 'friends' not 'servants' for a servant does not know what his master is doing. (John 15v15). We are Jesus' friends because he has shared 'everything I heard from His Father'. (John 15v15).

You are chosen to bear fruit, so that the Father may be glorified (John 15v8,15). You are empowered by God as soon as you ask (John 15v7,16). You are chosen and special the branches of the True Vine, tapped into the life-giving Holy Spirit that God will pour out into those who ask that His church may bear much fruit.

In these days between the Resurrection and His Ascension to heaven I believe Jesus spent much time with His disciples teaching them these simple Truths. I believe He wants to teach us the same Truths, you are chosen, you are special, you will bear much fruit, the Fathers waiting to pour out His Holy Spirit so that you will know and be empowered by Him.
